2023 Treasurers Annual Report

November 9th, 2023

The Racine Yacht Club had an adjusted income of \$42,993 for fiscal 2022. Through October, we have a gain in adjusted income of \$38,806. The board has done an excellent job of holding down expenses this year.

We have increased our savings/checking to \$305,499 and formed a new relationship with Summit Credit Union to earn higher returns on our savings balances. If necessary, we carry a \$50,000 revolving

line of credit as insurance. We have no

Lake Michigan water levels have been stable this year, as measured by the Army Corp of Engineers, with a current decrease of one inch vs. last year. Our exact water levels will vary vs. these trends, and dredging remains a significant financial exposure.

The current financial condition of the Club is acceptable to meet current day-today operations, but our buildings and pier system are old, and we must find a way to increase our reserves to make significant long-term improvements. Respectfully submitted Greg Miller

I have nothing to report for the month of November. I look forward, however, and thank the Club for placing your trust and confidence in me as your Rear Commodore this past year and continuing on in 2024! Rear Commodores' 2023 Annual Report: This year was a very productive year! One of my primary objectives was to help support our pier director and team get the East pier raised and we are proud to report that we achieved that objective with the hard work and dedication of so many of you. A lot of sweat went into that project, which will result in a substantial boost in revenue in 2024 for the Club. A special thanks to Heather Ellis, Charlie Manning, Rick Rowinski, Dave Janke, and my son Ole who were the key players in making this possible. Way to go! Secondly, I spent significant time networking with city, state, and local government officials with regards to our future needs with dredging and protection of our pier system. Maintaining strong lines of communication with these individuals and coordinating, where and when possible, will ultimately benefit the Club and potentially curb costs down the road. I reached out to several dredging companies and former dredgers I knew both locally

and nationally to better understand all options and resources to do everything we can to keep these future costs down to a minimum. This will take some very careful, coordinated, and strategic budgetary planning by the board in 2024 to stay on track. But I am confident that we will meet these challenges working together as a TEAM and staying positive.

We also made significant strides in the yard this year removing a lot of junk and clearing out dilapidated boat racks and boats out of our dry-sail area. Ultimately this will create more winter and summer storage space and revenue for the Club! Areas of improvements for 2024 for pier and yard directors will include: revision and streamlining of storage and pier contracts in addition to looking at fair and equitable transient slipping off the main dock. Pier Director Annual Report- 2023

Thanks to last year's mild winter, we only needed to run the ice eaters for twenty days. That is less than half as long as the previous year. We were still able to prove-out the new electric panels and monitoring system.

Slip rental increased by seven from the previous year to forty-nine for 2023 season. There were twelve slips available at the end of the season. Five of these were recovered after the end of the east pier was raised and rebuilt.

Besides all the regular maintenance work, several notable improvement projects were completed. There was a grand undertaking to restore the five slips at the end of the east pier, returning the slip system back to full capacity. We also installed a railing on the upper deck on the east pier, made security improvements, and added cross-bracing to many finger piers to reduce sway.

Lastly, with the water levels decreasing, the new CHIRP 2 sonar is expected to be quite helpful in understanding when dredging might be needed.

I am so appreciative of all the volunteers that donated so much of their time, energy, and skills to the maintenance and improvement of our pier system. Their dedication has ensured another successful year. Respectfully submitted, Heather Ellis


