Other than our \$9,000 lease payment, I don't know of significant expenses coming up. Kim had to move some money from savings to checking this month. The water level of Lake Michigan continues to drop. It went down four inches in the past month and is ten inches below last year. By-Laws: Mark Lukow sent an email. Attached here.

- 1. Suspension of SUMMER Membership Meetings: Our bylaws specify that suspending a meeting requires a majority vote at the meeting prior to the proposed suspensions. (Article X, Section A.). I met with Fred Stritt and he agreed to let this lay until the May GMM meeting.
- 2. Electronic voting: A member asked about electronic voting in general membership meetings (GMM.) The short answer is probably not, at least not
- Voting for officers and directors: Article V Section C states that "a majority vote of the members present shall elect a candidate to office" and makes provisions for absentee ballots to be cast at the clubhouse. Remote/electronic voting is not permitted for elections.
- Voting by "secure electronic means" is explicitly permitted for board meetings as specified in Article VI Section C of the bylaws.
- Robert's Rules of Order state that alternative methods of voting, such as mail, email, or fax must be specified in the bylaws.
- There are good reasons to allow/ promote virtual participation in GMM meetings. There are also challenges to running hybrid meetings and some changes and commitments we'd have to make. If the interest is sufficient we should pursue virtual participation, including a tweak to the bylaws.
- 3. ByLaws revised to Sept 2022. I'm having some technical issues on my end. I hope to get updated bylaws out soon.

RYC STAR FLEET NEWS

The Star Class held its 100th annual World Championship event September 8-17 at the Eastern Yacht Club, Marblehead, MA. Ross Adams, with crew AJ Brown, represented RYC and the Western Lake Michigan Star Fleet. They were scored 57th out of eighty-four boats with a best race finish of 33rd. Adams was scored 19th of twenty-three Master skippers, aged 50-60 years old. The regatta was Adams' seventh Star World Championship as either skipper or crew.

October 12-15, The Gull Lake (MI) Star Fleet hosted the 6th Annual Vintage Gold Cup Regatta at the Gull Lake Yacht Club, Richland, MI. Jack Rickard, with AJ Brown as crew, represented the WLM Fleet, and RYC, scoring 18th in a 25-boat fleet, with a best race placing of 10th, sailing the restored wooden "Bottoms Up." In doing so, Rickard revisited his roots in the class. He owned his first star, numbered 1160, at age fourteen, 68 years ago. The regatta is organized by the Gull Lake Fleet and Don Parfet and Jon VanderMolen, who restored fifteen of the boats, equipping them with modern rigs. Among competing skippers were seven Star Class world champions, including Lars Grael of Brazil who won the regatta with crew Isao Toyama, Star Olympians Mark Reynolds, and Paul Cayard, and Swedish champion and Star boat constructor Leif Carlsson.


