Financial Results

We are 7 months into our fiscal year with revenue +\$455 above last year and expenses \$3,171 below last year. In total we are performing better than our budget projections.

Committee expenses are in-line with both favorable and unfavorable variances.

Longer term capital expenditures should be considered if dredging is not expected in the next 2-3 years and our financial reserves are sufficient to cover the future dredging costs.

September 8th Water Levels Lake Michigan is decreased 1 inch versus a month ago. We are down 2 inches vs. one year ago, but up 6 inches vs. the long-term average. The lake is forecasted decrease 3 inches over the next month.

Golden Rule Project

The Golden Rule is a storied sailboat that helped bring about an end to atmospheric testing of nuclear weapons. It is a project of Veterans for Peace. This year the boat was on a 15 month, 11,000 mile voyage around the Great Lakes to inform and educate the public about the dangers of nuclear weapons proliferation.



From 1946 to 1958 the United States detonated 67 nuclear bombs in the Marshall Islands displacing indigenous inhabitants and spreading radiation around the globe. Efforts from a concerned public were unsuccessful in stopping the nuclear weapons testing, so in 1958 peace activists attempted to sail the Golden Rule from Los Angeles, California to the Marshall Islands to interfere with the tests.

This boat is the original peace ship, the Golden Rule, that set sail in 1958 to stop nuclear weapons test in the Marshall Islands, and which

inspired the many peace makers and peace ships that followed. This year the boat sailed the Great Loop stopping in Racine to do several educational talks. RYC was lucky to have a special presentation about their voyage and mission. Due to

the busy schedule at the Club, the event for our members was held at the beautiful Community Room at Lakeshore Towers. After that, the boat sailed to Chicago and former Sailing Instructor, Brandon Ellis sailed to and from Chicago aboard the boat. The boat was hauled out at Rivers End where it was packed up and trucked back to California.





It was fun to meet the crew and to listen to their heart warming stories. The Captain, Kiko Johnson-Kitazawa is a native Hawaiian. He gave a wonderful talk and powerpoint presentation at the Club about the evolution of the Hawaiian Canoe. The Canoe is double hulled and called Wa'akaulua.

I appreciate the warm welcome that Heather Ellis and our RYC family gave to the Captain and crew of the Golden Rule.




