Handwashing Sink • We are required to have a separate sink

for hand washing. We are also required to have 3 sinks for washing dishes. So, we cannot use any of our existing sinks. To reduce overall cost, we do not want to add additional plumbing across the room. In order to use existing plumbing, we need to keep the hand washing sink against the same wall as the existing sinks. I am looking at 2 different options.

Option 1 - Add a drop sink into the existing stainless-steel counter. Pro -Less expense than option 2 Con – reduced prep space Option 2 - Change out the stainlesssteel counter with a new counter design containing 4 total sinks (see diagram). Pro – More prepping room Con - Cost to order a new custom stainless-steel sink top No matter what we choose plumbing will have to be added and the hand washing sink will need to be labeled

accordingly.

### Fire deficiency

While we were having the hood and fans maintained it came to our attention we have a fire department deficiency in the hood exhaust vent. There is conduit running thru the vent. We will need to remove and re-route the conduit and patch the holes in the vent.

#### Closed Projects

Redesigning the hood in Kitchen is not cost effective or practical at this time. The deep fryer gas valve had to be replaced

Someone has taken about half of the forks and knives from the kitchen resulting in

RYC having to order additional forks and knives.

I am going to place the following in the e-blast and newsletter:




