Monthly Results

March was a positive month with Net Income of \$12,728 vs. a budget of \$10,396.

Higher income from racing fees helped offset timing of higher house expenses in the month. House expenses were higher in the month related to the install of the water fountain, hand washing sink in the kitchen, and drain rebuilds in the women's shower and behind the bar.

Year to Date Results

YTD Net Income is \$43,163 which is above budget and \$3,434 above the same time last year.

Our total checking and savings balance is \$259,000 which is \$78,000 higher than the same time one year ago. Dredging appears unlikely to occur this fiscal year, and we will explore putting more funds into longer term CDs.

April 7th Water Levels

Lake Michigan rose +4 inches versus a month ago, but is (-4) inches the same time last year. We are +5 inches higher than the March long term average. During the next 30 days, Lake Michigan is expected to rise 4 more inches.

We will start using Quickbooks Online starting 4/14/23. This is a cloud-based program.

We are putting together a financial audit committee. This will consist

of Greg Miller, Frank Randall, Edgar Hoffman and Stacy Buettner.

**PIER DIRECTOR'S REPORT:**

A Deeper CHIRP 2 castable sonar unit and boat mount was purchased for assessing the water depths in our slip system. If this works, we should have decent sounding capability from the dock and the ability to create printable maps. We should also be able to do year-to-year

studies of our slip system, giving us better insight into dredging needs. We are not anticipating water depth issues but should have a better idea once the sounding is complete. Mark Lukow completed a manual sounding of a few critical points in the system and reported no concerns with the current level (approx.. 7' at the lowest point checked). I'm still finalizing the slip plan. No significant changes, except where requested. All boats on the waitlist have been assigned a slip, and I expect we will have 9 available. 71% of slip contracts have been submitted. The ice eaters ran for 20 days this winter (26 days less than last winter). They are expected to be dirtier than usual due to their lack of use. The pier power will be turned on, and the water meter will be installed on 4/14. Water will remain off to the piers until there is no risk of a freeze. The Water Patrol delivered the floating docks. Thank you to the anonymous helper(s) that moved and installed the dinghy dock. Besides launch day on 5/13 and yard & dock day on 5/20, we have plenty of need for help. Projects include pier/ finger board replacement, pressure washing, water line repair, etc. Work or Pay hours are available. Please let me know if you can help.
